

2024-2025 ADVANCED STANDING CURRICULUM OVERVIEW

This Curriculum Overview outlines the plan of study requirements for students in the 36-Credit Advanced Standing Program. Advanced Standing status is available to students who have completed an undergraduate program in social work accredited by the Council on Social Work Education, within five years prior to their enrollment at the university.

CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS

Advanced Standing students are required to take 36 credits based on their selected Concentration. The requirements include an advanced policy course, (4) 3-credit methods courses in the selected concentration and (3) electives.

Advanced Standing students typically transfer 24 credits of the Foundation curriculum from their BSW program. If an advanced course requires any of the following pre-requisites, as noted at the end of this document, they have been met by corresponding BSW courses. However, if the corresponding course was not offered in the BSW program, or if the student earned a grade lower than a "B" in that course, they must add that MSW Foundation course to their plan of study to successfully complete the MSW program.

Advanced Field Practicum

The Advanced Field Practicum setting is determined by the selected Concentration, which students will officially declare to the program on their Advanced Field application. Advanced Field is two consecutive semesters scheduled typically on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays unless specified otherwise by the Field agency. Students also have the option of a two-day a week Advanced Extended field placement, which extends the internship into July.

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Program Concentrations

Students are required to select a concentration (Clinical or Leadership, Policy, & Social Change). It is possible to select a secondary concentration with a primary one. Students who select a primary and secondary concentration are placed in their Advanced Field Practicum based upon their primary concentration. A secondary concentration will expose the student to some of the content from the other concentration in two courses. Each concentration has specific course requirements, which are identified below.
